### **COP Response to Incident in Charlottesville, Va.**

The Council of Presidents stand together with our membership against the violence and protest that occurred this weekend in Charlottesville, Va. by the evil, racist, thoughtless individuals who identify themselves as white supremacist. As anti-racism organizations, we are committed to purposefully identifying and challenge issues of race and color and the impact on our members and others.

We want to emphasize the urgency of the situation here in America and call for the United States Government to find effective means to help ensure that attacks on innocent law abiding Americans will not be tolerated. The events of last weekend provided a clear example of domestic terrorism. The behavior of a few will indeed negatively impact the future safety of many if we don't take deliberate and strategic action to ensure that all citizens enjoy the same measure of freedom and democracy.
