"The resignations of President Tom Wolfe and Chancellor R. Bowen Loftin are one of many steps needed to improve the campus climate for students across the nation. Recent incidents at the University of Missouri - Columbia, Yale University and the University of Louisville must not be tolerated."

The sorority's Delta Tau Chapter has actively participated in the protest and calls for university leadership to take action.

"We call on the university to conduct diversity training for all employees and students and to develop a 'safe space' for students to voice concerns when campus issues arise," Buckhanan Wilson said. Buckhanan Wilson said Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, with a massive network of members in 986 local chapters worldwide, plans to continue monitoring this situation.
